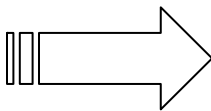
All of us have already enjoyed our beautiful Guyer Garden. Some of you may not have noticed that a half to a third of that space on the north side of our church has not been touched. Because of a generous grant from the David H. Shortridge II Foundation, we are now able to do that work. Our plan is to extend the fence between the playground and the Columbine Clinic to block the view of the parking lot. We will clean and weed the



drainage ditch on that end, add top soil and spread wildflower seed to complete a beautiful wild garden. About an 8X10 space between that wild garden and the area where one picnic table now sits will also be enriched with top soil and planted with perennials. The area where that table sits will have a new foundation of pine mulch. The picnic tables themselves will be sanded and sealed. The area, now a drainage ditch between the church directly to the east of the present garden and playground, will be re-ditched, and drainage pipe put in, covered with top soil and planted with perennials. Some additional paths will be added to give access across the garden and the playground. Our plan is to have all of this completed by the end to August. To do this, we will need volunteer help. 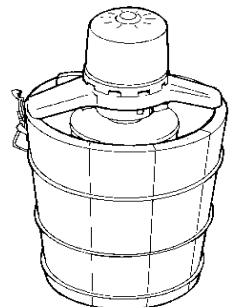
